The fields of Bedford have been trod by many fine people, but the devotion with which he put his mind, heart and body into the work so necessary in a recreation program such as the 3-F League and the Bedford Umpire Association has left its mark upon the lives of many, many boys. This legacy, hopefully, will be passed on by them to other boys of the future. Then they in turn, will know that no man stands taller than when he bends to place and arm around the shoulder of a boy who struck out or threw a home-run pitch.

Any man who brought his team into contest with and his boys knew that he had better be on his toes and know his rules because he would soon find out he was in a ballgame, and would be, until the last out of the last inning. One of Bob's most satisfying games was played on Field Day, 1961, when after helping Bud with the All Star team at the Monroe County Fair, he took the boys who did not make the team (calling them the Old Timers) and beat Bud and the Champs. He always credited Gary Mossburg with the idea that won the game---that of placing short-stop between first and second when Bill Sudoff came up to bat. That game was the source of many a chuckle over the years, the last time being weeks ago as the tow sat at our kitchen table going over a scale model Bob was building of an invention Bud had patented. Baseball crept into their conversations, no matter what they were doing.

Bob was justly proud of the new umpire association, which he founded, and was zealous in his efforts to make it a good and lasting unit that would fulfill the needs of the community. It must not falter nor fail with his passing because that would be a shameful waste of time out of a man's life, time that he could have spent sitting in his easy chair instead of creating more work for himself.

To Joyce and their sons Tom, Steve and Gary, we offer the sympathy of the entire League and wish with all our hearts that this bitter cup could have passed from them. When words fail us, our hearts are full. God keep you in the palm of His Hand.

When first invited to write about Bob Dusseau for this edition of the Pulletin, I accepted readily because there are so many things to say about a man of his quality. As I sought to organize my thoughts, it became apparent that mere words are so inadequate to depict or portray such a dedicated human being. There's no doubt about it, I have not touched upon many important things he contributed. These are just random thoughts about a Quiet-Voiced Man.
