ALL STARS

For the benefit of the people associated with our 3B program who have not had the opportunity to participate in 3B All Star team programs previously, we would like to take this opportunity to explain the tremendous effort and responsibility that is required for the team to be a success.

Being part of an All Star team representing the community, engaged competitively with teams from other communities, provides a rare opportunity for the boys who make the team. Two members from each minor division team are chosen by their respective manager's for tryouts. The managers are responsible to select boys who have displayed exceptional physical ability and team spirit throughout the season.

This year thirty-two boys, representing sixteen different teams,

were eligible to tryout for the All Star team.

A grading system is used and each boy is recognized for his overall playing ability and various skills such as running, batting, fielding and so forth. In addition, recognition is given for hustle and general attitude.

Each year it becomes more difficult to select players. Our league has grown considerably in the last few years. The number of teams competing in the minor division and the quality of players has improved tremendously. The playing skills, hustle and attitude qualities of the boys is a result of this groth, and the patience and efforts of the managers, umpires and league officials in all 3B divisions, especially our Farm Club program.

The most difficult task for the manager and coaches is at the conclusion of the tryout period when the fifteen actual team players must be chosen. Everyone must realize even the most talented and experienced professional baseball scout can make a mistake in evaluating the ability of a player. There is some consolation for the manager and coaches in knowing, that most Little Leaguers learn early that no one is successful in every effort and the boys will soon overcome their disappointment.

Obviously the manager and coaches appointed for the All Star team are the key men required to make the team a success. They must carry out practice sessions, procure and maintain player records and be responsible for the league playing equipment, uniforms and safety of the players. They are also responsible for the conduct of the team at the play-off games because any violation of the rules of good sportsmanship would be a reflection on the total community.

This year must have been exceptionally difficult and frustrating for the team manager Jim Alford and his coaches Bob Maloy and Jerry Kuhr. Due to bad weather conditions games were postponed and the Alford and Maloy families had their vacations delayed and shortened. Inspite of these additional handicaps and through the personal efforts of Jim, Bob, and Jerry, a successful All Star team represented Bedford Township at the Monroe County Fair and reached the finals.

Although the team finished runner-up in the finals, losing to Monroe after defeating Petersburg and Carleton, Jim, Bob, and Jerry have earned the gratitude and respect of all the players, coaches and parents of this years team.
