## Alumni Association announces Hall of Fame inductees

The Bedford High School Alumni Association has named its 2010 Hall of Fame Inductees.

The 1975-76 high school champion wrestling team will be inducted, along with Richard Harley, outstanding high school teacher; 1985 graduate Doug Harper, outstanding athlete; 1964 graduate Michael Morris, outstanding post-high school accomplishment; 1999 graduate Shayna Munson, outstanding athlete; 1951 graduate Arnold Strzelecki, outstanding athlete, and 1987 graduate Matt Wiederhold, outstanding theater arts student and post-high school accomplishments.

The wrestling team won the school's first state championship in any sport. The team was coached by Bill Regnier.

Mr. Harley taught math and science from 1973-2009.

Mr. Harper was Bedford's first three-star state place-winner in any sport. In wrestling, he was the 1984 state champion at 98 pounds and the 1985 state champion at 103 pounds. In both seasons, he was undefeated.

Mr. Morris is currently president, chairman and chief executive officer of American Electric Power Co. Inc., one the largest producers of electricity in the United States. He was past president and CEO

of Consumers Energy in Michigan. He served on the Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents from 1997-2004.

Ms. Munson played volleyball and basketball in high school. She was first team All-State as a junior and senior in volleyball. She currently plays on a beach volleyball tour.

Mr. Strzelecki was a track speed runner. He scored an average of 16 points in most meets during the 1949-1951 seasons. He won the 100- and 200-yard dash, broad jump and anchored the half-mile relay team.

Mr. Wiederhold was a member of the symphony and marching band and

performed in various theater productions. He is currently executive director of Main Street Medina in Medina, Ohio.

The candidates will be inducted during a banquet on Oct. 23.

They also will be honored Oct. 22 during halftime of the Bedford High School varsity football game.
