• Vans operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and go anywhere

• All vans are wheelchair accessible

• 72-hour advance notice is required

Volunteer Transportation:

MI Dept. Health & Human Service & Monroe County Opportunity Program (734) 241-2775

• Retired & Senior Volunteer Program volunteers and community volunteer drivers will transport seniors, fragile adults, and “at risk” individuals and families to appointments necessary to their health, safety & welfare when other transportation is unaffordable or unavailable.

Cancer Connection (734) 240-5400

• Cancer Connection provides “hands-on” non-clinical assistance to residents of Monroe County who have been diagnosed with cancer – including transportation. Cancer Connection travels within a 50 mile area from the Monroe Cancer Center. They provide cancer patients (all ages) who are able to walk unassisted with transportation to their cancer related appointments such as treatments, testing, and doctor’s appointments. Services are free but donations are accepted. 48-hour notice of appointments is preferred.
